History aims	 The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor Viking raids and invasion resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, first king of England further Viking invasions and Danegeld Anglo-Saxon laws and justice Edward the Confessor and his death in 1066
Geography aims	 use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage (ks1) locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) and North and South America (ks2) Identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern and Southern hemisphere and the equator (ks2)
DT aims	 Making a Viking boat/shield generate, develop, model and communicate their ideas through talking and drawing select from and use a range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks [for example, cutting, shaping, joining and finishing] evaluate their ideas and products against design criteria
