RE aims	Why does Easter matter to Christians? 1.5 Digging Deeper Children will learn: - to recognise that God, Incarnation, Gospel and Salvation are part of the 'big story' of the Bible to tell stories of Holy Week and Easter and make a link with the idea of Salvation (Jesus rescuing people) to give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus as saviour in church worship to think, talk and ask questions about whether the text has something to say to them (for example, about whether forgiveness is important), exploring different ideas.
