



- A couple of very small leaks which have caused no damage any repairs will be covered by the team.







The day to day is going well, even with the new teachers, everyone seems to be settling well.


I think the school is very well organised, and as a parent we are kept very well updated with what is happening.


Feedback from Parents What is Working Well..


Improvement of Children's Learning Experience

Parental communication for academic achievement of children. Many dojo posts are about sports outings or pieces of art but we see very little celebration of academic outcomes or even what is happening in lessons.





More storage, so toilets don't have to be used to hold other items.



I'd like to ask that the forum to consider whether parents should be informed when there are confirmed cases of covid in the school. I was surprised that this information was not shared with the parents of my own children's class mates when they were confirmed as infected given that they are in such close contact. This information would enable parents to be extra vigilant monitoring children for symptoms and, of equal if not greater importance, make an informed decision around contact with family members who are immunosuppressed when cases are actively circulating. 


Better signage to slow traffic down, zebra crossing etc more of a council thing I guess but definitely a huge concern of mine.




Before and after school care for working parents.


